Eliphalet Barber Miller

On July 21, 1862, he enlisted for the Union and was an honored veteran of the Civil War. He went to the front as a private in C Company 68th Regiment, Indiana Volunteer Infantry. He was discharged three years later as a sergeant of C Company on June 25, 1865 in Nashville, Tennessee.

After the war he went to Illinois where he devoted his attention to farming.

Around 1883, he and his family returned to Rush County, Indiana, purchasing 147 acres of land which he farmed until his death.

Documentation for the children born in Douglas County, Illinois, is from affidavits found in Eliphalet's Civil War Pension file and from personal papers, in my possession, prepared by Sylvia B. (WALKER) MILLER.

Stella, Orval, Ariel (pronounced Earl), Otis, and Ethel were born in Illinois. Angus and Harry were born in Rush County, Indiana, and their births are on record there.

Orvil H. Miller

The following is a transcription of an obituary taped to the MILLER Bible:

ORVAL M. MILLER, son of E. B. and Mary C. MILLER, was born in Douglas County, Illinois, February 19th, 1893 [typo: 1873], and died in Rush County, Indiana, December 20th, 1895, aged 22 years, 10 months and 1 day. He was converted and joined the church of the United Brethren in Christ, February 19th, 1894, and continued faithful until death. He leaves 2 sisters, 4 brothers and many relatives and friends to mourn their loss, but their loss is his eternal gain. Funeral services were conducted by the writer. J. T. HOLMES.

The following were in other local papers:

The Tuesday Republican, Rushville, Indiana Dec 24, 1895

Orville H. MILLER, of near Andersonville, son of the late Richard MILLER, died last Friday evening. He was twenty-two years of age and had the respect of all who knew him. He was buried on Sunday at Hopewell graveyard.

Rushville Graphic, Friday, Dec. 27, 1895

Died, Orville MILLER, on Friday evening at 6 o'clock, of consumption of the brain. Funeral at Mt. Zion U. B. church on Sunday afternoon conducted by Rev. Holmes; interment immediately after at Hopewell cemetery. The deceased was a member of the U. B. church, and an upright and exemplary young man. May his ashes rest in peace.

Otis Logan Miller

Otis is incorrectly listed as a daughter on the 1870 census for Douglas County, Illinois.

After the death of his parents, Otis was reared in the family of Jesse I. and Loella Lafforge. Loella was his cousin, the daughter of Charles S. MILLER.

He became a prominent farmer in Rush County and has a large write-up in the Rush County History books. It states, "Genial in disposition and unassuming in manner, he enjoys to a marked degree the respect and esteem of the entire community in which he lives."

SEVERAL HURT IN SERIES OF MISHAPS

Otis Miller of Richland Township Most Seriously Injured When Automobile Upsets

THREE OTHER ACCIDENTS...

...Several people were hurt, one seriously, and a number of others narrowly escaped serious injury in series of accidents in Rushville and vicinity over the week end.

The one that ended the most disastrously occurred near Andersonville late Saturday evening when five passenger a Chalmers touring car belonging to and driven by Otis Miller of Richland township turned over west of Andersonville at cross roads. Mr. Miller lost control of the car and it went into the ditch.

With Mr. Miller were Dr. Lowel M. Green and son Thomas of this city and Mr. Miller's son Charles all of whom were scratched bruied. Mr. Miller's hands pinned under the car and were badly cut and bruised and several bones were broken.

Thomas Green suffered a slight flesh wound in the back and was bruised, but will suffer no ill effects from the injury, it is believed. Dr Green has a few scratches on the face to show for his experrience and Charles Miller was only slightly hurt.

Mr. Miller was brought to Dr. Frank H. Green's hospital here for treatment in Dr. Green's car, which was following a short distance behind and was being driven by Mrs. Green. Mrs. Miller and daughters and Lowell Green, Jr., were riding with her. Several stitches had to be taken in his hands to close the wounds.

The top of the automobile was smashed, the windshield bent and broken, the steering wheel and rod bent, the front end bent and the fenders on the left side were smashed....

Harry Theston Miller

Harry's mother died at his birth and his sister Stella, who was seventeen at the time, took care of the children until their father's death less than a year later. At that time the two youngest children, Harry and Angus, went to the home next to their own and lived with Emma Stevens, a close family friend (and possibly household keeper) with whom they lived until their adulthood.

Emma Stevens, born March 25, 1861 and died in January of 1937, raised the children in the brick house that had been built by their grandfather, Archibald.

Harry farmed all his life, first in Richland Township in Rush County and later in Noble Township, raising general crops and hogs.

In June of 1945, Harry and Sylvia moved to a farm near New Salem, then moved into his brother Angus' house in New Salem in September of 1948. Angus died in that house in December of 1950.

"Harry T. MILLER who is conspicuous among the enterprising farmers and stock raisers of Noble Township, has succeeded in his chosen life work through the qualities of persistence, sound judgement and honorable dealings, which have earned for him the esteem of the entire community. Harry MILLER is a native of Rush County, having been born in Richland Township on October 28, 1886, and he is the son of Eliphalet and Mary (Mollie) MILLER. He is indebted to the common schools of Richland Township for his educational training and after completing his studies he took employment as a farm hand for six years in that community. During the following four years he cultivated a farm of 94 acres in Richland Township, and then he moved to Noble Township, where he rented a Farm of 240 acres. Two years later he located on a farm where he now resides, comprising of 175 acres, and here he is farming with a gratifying measure of success. He carries on general farming, raising all the crops common to the locality, and he also feeds about 200 hogs annually. He is thorough and methodical and is up-to-date in his ideas relative to farming. Mr. MILLER was married to Sylvia WALKER, daughter of Daniel and Belle (KENNEDY) WALKER and they are the parents of three children, Donald, Dorotha Belle, and Gladys. Mrs. MILLER, who is a native of Rush County, is a lady of many estimable qualities of character and is a popular member of the circles in which she moves. Politically, Mr. MILLER is a republican.

Reminiscence of David STEWART about his grandfather, Harry MILLER as directed to his sister, Becky: "My memories are somewhat different from those of most others during my early years, because I got to see them in a somewhat different light, because I was fortunate to be our parent's middle child. There was a period of several years during which our parents had some difficult times, and I was lucky enough to be at a good-age to be, literally, 'farmed out'. When I started staying on the farm a lot, when I was three and four, you were too little, and Larry was already in school. Our grandparents, Harry and Sylvia (whom Grandpa called Sylvie) lived on a small farm near Orange, Indiana, (really just a slick-spot in the road, I think) which consists in my memory as a blacksmiths shop which repaired farm equipment and a truck stop which sold ice cream. Some of my first memories are of being at the blacksmiths, seeing the bellows make the fire spark and watching how all the men could really spit good. Then after that entertainment, we would go eat ice cream with red stuff (strawberry, I now know, and the cause of my being partial to that red stuff all my life) on to. It feels to me as if we did that pretty often, because Grandpa would ask me, in front of Grandma; 'Well, what should we do now?' Which was my cue to say, 'Get red stuff,' and he'd tell Grandma, 'I guess we gotta go.' (She was never invited and never went along.)"

Later addition/correction:

"... what I recalled as Orange was actually Andersonville, Indiana. Our Aunt Dorotha lives near Orange. Mom says the old men talking and spitting that I remembered were disparagingly called 'the loafers'. I didn't write, but had to confirm with Mom, that there was an old country store with a wooden porch on which old men sat in cane-back and rocking chairs. I recall that in addition to spitting, they whittled at this location. (Whittling is not carving. When you whittle, you turn a long stick into a short one by cutting off shavings.) My image of the store was clear, but it was such a cliché of the times I felt it might be a false memory, but apparently not.....

Mom always refers to the farm near Glenwood as her folk's place because she and her older siblings grew up there. Our Uncle Dick lived on the Andersonville farm as a late adolescent, when I was first staying there. His wife, our Aunt Fayellen, lived on a farm just across the road. I remember because Grandma worried out-loud a lot about how to keep them apart while living so close. I'm not sure when the move was made, but I can't recall ever being on Mom's childhood farm. It was a socioeconomic downward move, I'm sure, because Glenwood is in the rich flatlands while Andersonville is at the edge of the hilly country. I once mentioned to Aunt Dorotha something about Grandpa losing the good farm, and she just said, 'Lose it? He threw it away!' But I loved the one I knew."

On his WW2 registration card of 27 Apr 1942, Harry's description is : Height 5' 8", Weight 115, hazel eyes, gray hair, light complexion.
